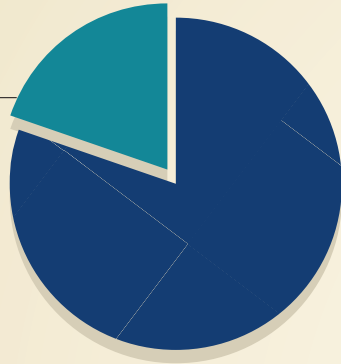

Year Ending June 30, 2014

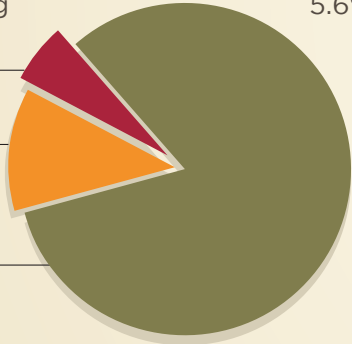
Revenue \$1,942,642

40 YEARS HELPING FAMILIES & YOUTH

For over 40 years, Parrott Creek has been providing youth involved in the juvenile justice system and their families with the tools, skills and emotional support they need to address negative behavioral patterns and get back on the right path to success. Parrott Creek works with youth and their families through the following programs:

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

35 YOUTH

Residential therapeutic program- The Ranch

Long term residential care and 11 hours of weekly intensive treatment including skill building, individual, group and family therapy, on-site schooling and educational enrichment activities.

50 YOUTH

Shelter Care

Short term crisis intervention care and 6 hours of Behavioral Rehabilitation Services, on-site schooling and educational enrichment activities.

COMMUNITY BASED PROGRAMS

350 YOUTH

Diversions

First time youth offenders meet with Community Accountability Panel, rather than a juvenile court officer, to tailor consequences for their actions and help them develop skills that keep them from making the same mistake again.

25 YOUTH

Lifeguards

A treatment program for youth who have exhibited inappropriate sexual behaviors. Youth participate in individual, family and group therapy sessions to provide a holistic approach to treatment and to prevent further offenses.

150 FAMILIES

STAR (Steps to Active Recovery)

An advocacy and outreach program for parents struggling with alcohol and/or drug addiction issues.
